



Christingle at PHP

On the 30th November at 1:30pm Pool Hayes Primary walked up to the Holy Trinity Church. We went there for a Christingle service. Year 5 told us about where Christingle originated from and the history behind it. Christingle celebrations are named after the Christingles that are lit during the service. Christingles are made from an orange decorated with red tape, sweets and a candle. Each piece of the Christingle holds special symbolism to help us understand the importance of Jesus and the Gospel, and why it's important at Christmas time.

- The orange represents the world
- The red ribbon symbolises the love and blood of Christ
- The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations
- The lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness

- The Christingle Song




Perfect Peer Support
