Year 4 children have worked hard all year embedding their times table knowledge. Their multiplication check was this week. Each child had 6 seconds to type in the solution to a multiplication question. Again, the children showed their great attitudes to learning by doing their absolute best. Mr. Harris, Mrs. Guy and the other staff who work with the children are very proud of them. Having embedded times tables knowledge will benefit them enormously as they develop their mathematical knowledge and skill moving into Upper Key Stage 2 in September.

Our gardeners worked hard on Tuesday tending to the pots at the front of school. Mrs. Devey works with them to guide them as they nurture our flowers, fruit and vegetables from seed and bulb into fully grown plants. They're doing a marvellous job.

Thank you to the families who have contacted me to check I know about a van parked on the school grounds overnight this week. We've had some work completed on our lighting at school. Our expensive fluorescent lights have been replaced by LEDs and will be taken for recycling. You may notice the lighting upgrade includes our outdoor lights. This was funded by the DfE and will hopefully make a big difference to our energy bills.









Year 2 have been working hard in science. They've identified the properties of materials and matched different items to materials. They explored objects in the classroom and determined what materials they were made from.
