


The children have been inspired, challenged and have definitely been learning!




Nursery have been learning about snowmen this week. They've been practising using their fine motor skills by using funky fingers to pick up buttons and place them onto the snowman. The children were encouraged to use their thumb and forefinger to 'pinch' the buttons to move them. This is great exercise to prepare them to write with a pencil.




This week, Reception class have been learning about things being the odd one out. The children created their own games for a friend showing the odd one out. Here is Hope with her own game for her friend.





Year 1 have begun their new history topic about the history of toys. They've started by discussing their favourite toys currently and sharing them with their class - this is a great starting point before they begin to move back into older toys that families, great-grandparents and great, great-grandparents would have played with. Here is work from Sukhjapp and Seerat sharing their current favourite toys - a drone and a princess puzzle.






In Year 4, the children have been creating settings. Here is Kevin's early draft using description to create his setting.
